EDUCATIONAL PROGRAM FOR CHILDREN (Rupees 18.36 Million)

- Financial assistance was given in **57 schools**.
- 35 schools are in Hyderabad (Telengana State).
22 schools are in other States (4 in A.P., 2 in TN, 1 in Karnataka, 6 in UP, 3 in Haryana, 1 in West Bengal, 3 in Bihar and 2 in Madhya Pradesh).
- Salaries were paid to **94 teachers in 22 schools**.
- Established “SEED Elite Nursery” in one slum area school.
- Built a new school for poor children.

NEW PROJECTS

■ FIRST SEED ELITE NURSERY

SEED established First “Elite Nursery” at a school in Hyderabad as a “Pilot Program”. In Slum area schools, the children come from families where parents are not educated and do not provide any assistance in children’s education. The purpose of this program is to provide slum area children a solid foundation upon which they can start their educational journey. SEED hopes that by receiving state of the art education in pre-kindergarten, the slum area children will have the necessary tools to study on their own in primary grades as well as compete with their counterparts from more privileged socioeconomic backgrounds.

SEED plans to develop its **Elite Nursery Program** upon its existing pilot program by opening many such nurseries in slum area schools. The pilot program is in collaboration with Huda School, a local non-profit school committed to providing quality education to the slum area children. The pilot program **initial setup cost is \$5,000 that includes teaching materials, school uniforms, furniture. Operating (recurring) expenses are \$4,000 per year** that supplements the tuition fee for 50 slum area children and includes salaries of qualified teachers. The students pay a nominal tuition fee which is assessed based on the family’s income.



■ NEW SCHOOL FOR POOR CHILDREN

SEED partially funded construction of a new school building in Borvancha village, Nuzvid, Krishna District in Andhra Pradesh. 45% of the population in this area is poor and most children do not go to school. SEED partnered with a local NGO and helped in starting a new school. First phase of construction is complete and school is in operation. There are 50 students.

90% percent of these students are getting free-of-cost schooling. In June of 2018 with the start of new academic year the strength of this school is expected to be about 200 children.

MEDICAL AID PROGRAM (Rupees 8.52 Million)

During 2017, 36,000 poor received free medical aid under our program.

We are grateful to Islamic Medical Association of North America (IMANA) for their Grant of \$55,000 (Rupees 3.52 Million) that supports this program

■ PRIMARY CARE CENTER

- A total of 25,100 patients (2,100 patients per month) received primary medical care. Women and children are 85% of the patients at this Clinic.
- Primary Care Center is staffed with experienced professionals and is equipped with a diagnostic laboratory. 4,000 Diagnostic tests were conducted during 2017.
- Quality care is provided to poor people at no cost to them.

■ DIABETIC CARE

- A total of 10,500 Patients received Diabetic Care at 4 Centers in Hyderabad.
- 85% of the patients have stable or lower blood sugar levels.

■ MATERNITY CARE

- Maternity Deliveries at Tayyab Trust, Deoband, UP.
- During 2017, 25 Maternity Deliveries (12 Caesarian and 13 normal Deliveries) were performed using SEED/IMANA funds.

■ EMERGENCY MEDICAL RELIEF

- SEED is working with **Helping Hand Foundation** of Hyderabad, India to provide Emergency Medical Relief to the poor in cases of major medical emergencies like accidents, surgeries, cancer treatment etc.

■ SUCCESSFUL COCHLEAR IMPLANT SURGERY GIVES HEARING TO A 5 YEAR OLD BOY

M. Uddin had severe hearing loss from birth and was not able to hear or speak. SEED arranged surgery for this child. He is in speech therapy and learning to speak. SEED has paid for surgery and for high end Hearing Aids for this Child. M. Uddin's father divorced his mother. She is living with her elderly unemployed father. Family could not afford the cost of this treatment. Last year SEED paid for Cochlear Implant surgery for 8 year old brother of M. Uddin who was unable to hear/speak. He is in school now.

■ MR. SH COMPLETED BE DEGREE IN 2017

Mr. SH's father abandoned the family and his mother raised him by working as a house maid. SEED has paid educational expenses for his engineering degree. At present Mr. SH is taking a Post-Graduate Diploma under SEED sponsorship to improve his chances of employment.

■ MISS A. BEGUM COMPLETED BTech. DEGREE IN 2017

Miss A. Begum's mother is a housemaid. Upon the recommendation of one of SEED's donor, Miss A. Begum was given scholarship for her engineering course. She has successfully completed her degree.



■ MISS H. A. B. JOINED CHARTERED CERTIFICATE ACCOUNTANT COURSE

Miss H. A. B is an eighteen year old bright student who scored 96% in the subjects of Economics, Business and Accounting in her Pre-University examination. She wanted to become a chartered accountant and her family could not afford the expenses of this 3-year course (Rupees 400,000). One of the SEED donors is contributing 50% and SEED is paying 50% of her expenses. She is in the first year of Association of Chartered Certified Accountants (ACCA), a globally recognized 3-year course.



■ MS. Z. K. STUDYING IN FINAL YEAR OF BSc MEDICAL LAB TECHNOLOGY COURSE

Ms. Z. K. is a widow with one daughter. She is 23 years old and was an excellent student before her marriage. After her husband's death she wanted to study to support herself. She lives with her father who is a truck driver. Father is unable to bear her educational expenses. SEED is helping her. She is in the 3rd and final year of her degree. She scored 95% in her first and second year examinations. After graduation she will be able to get a job and lead a respectable life.



■ MISS M. M. IS IN FINAL YEAR OF ME (ENGINEERING)

Miss M. M.'s father passed away. Her mother is a house maker. Her grandmother was paying her educational expenses from her pension. Grandmother died and Miss M. M. could not pay her tuition as well as hostel fee. Her College Principal approached SEED. Now SEED is paying her tuition and hostel expenses. She has passed her first year examination with 86% of marks. She is expected to complete her degree in 2018.



■ FAMILY IN DISTRESS GETS FINANCIAL SUPPORT

Shaik M. used to work as a Mason earning a decent wage. He and his family were living a decent life. Then one year ago Shaik M. lost his leg in an accident. He could not work anymore. His wife is a house maid and the family was in deep financial trouble. The wife approached SEED. We put the family on SEED Widow & Destitute Family Support Program and granted a monthly Stipend of Rupees 5,000. SEED also paid tuition fee of two elder daughters who are in college. Shaik M. will be given a Prosthetic leg by SEED. He is under training for Prosthetic leg.



■ 50 WOMEN ARE EMPLOYED AT SAFA PRODUCTION CENTER



SEED funded a Production Center in partnership with Safa Women's Society.

■ ABANDONED FAMILY GETS SUPPORT

Ms. M. Sultana's husband abandoned her and her 3 children 8 years ago and disappeared. She raised her children by sewing clothes and doing odd jobs. She put her only son in an Engineering College but could not pay his tuition fee and her son dropped out. He was working in a grocery store to support the family. Ms. Sultana's oldest daughter is in "Deeni Madrasa". Second daughter could not join college due to financial hardship. We have admitted the son in Automobile Technician Course and admitted the second daughter in Teacher's Training Course. We are also paying expenses of this family for one year. After one year both children will complete training and will be able to help the family and SEED will stop financial aid to this family.



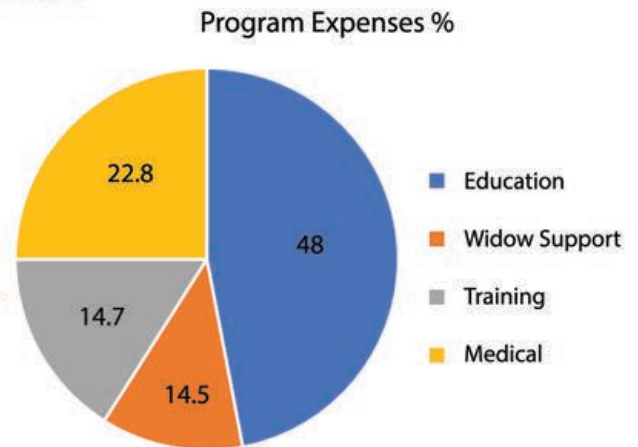
