MISSION

1. EDUCATION PROGRAM

- **For orphans and destitute children:** Assistance consists of tuition, books, school supplies and uniforms, teacher's training, salaries for teachers, and support for computers, libraries, science laboratories. SEED also guides slum area school management in improving educational standards and quality of education.
- **For deserving students:** Scholarships are granted to deserving students for college education.
- **Memorial and Merit Scholarships:** These scholarships are given for "Post Graduate Studies" and are granted in memory of donor's loved ones. Minimum donation amount is set at \$1,000.

ACHIEVEMENTS

- Educated **105,000 slum area Children.**
- Started Computer Classes in **17 schools** by providing **144 Computers.**
- **6 Lap Top computers** were given to engineering students.
- Aid was provided for **constructing 2 school buildings.**
- Purchased a **bus** for one school.
- **Water Purification (Reverse Osmosis) systems** were installed in **5 institutions.**
- **395 teachers** were trained.
- **2,200 Scholarships** were given for college education.

SEED ELITE NURSERY PROGRAM:

In 2017, SEED established first "Elite Nursery" at a school in Hyderabad. In poor localities children come from families where parents are illiterate and they have no resources to assist their children in education. Most of these children fail in school and dropout.

The purpose of this program is to provide slum area children "state of the art" education to give them a solid academic foundation so they could start their educational journey.

To-date SEED has established 4 Elite Nurseries.



2. WIDOW & DESTITUTE FAMILY SUPPORT PROGRAM

This program was started in 2013. Financial aid is given to widows, single mothers and destitute families so that they can live a respectable life and their children can go to school.

3. EMPLOYMENT TRAINING PROGRAM

This program was started to train youth who have dropped out of school and are unemployed. Free of cost vocational training is provided to lead these youth towards employment and respectable life.

ACHIEVEMENTS: BENEFICIARIES 8,900 UNEMPLOYED YOUTH TRAINED

- Established fully equipped Vocational Training Center in Hyderabad that is providing Auto-mechanic, Air Conditioning and Refrigeration and Electrician training to 100 trainees per year.
- Established Partnership with an Industrial Training Institute in Bhopal, Madhya Pradesh. We are granting financial aid to 85 trainees per year.
- Established an Auto-Mechanic Training Center in Bhopal that is training 25 trainees per year.
- Established a training Center in Hyderabad that provides computer and language skills as well offers "Retail Management Training".
- Established Partnership with Coaching Center in Patna, Bihar. This center offers coaching for State Civil Services examination as well English language and soft skills training.

4. MEDICAL SUPPORT PROGRAM

SEED OPERATES:

- 2 fully equipped and staffed Primary Care Centers in Hyderabad.
- 3 Mini-Clinics providing Quick Care to needy.
- 5 Diabetic Care Centers.

SEED PROVIDES:

- Emergency Medical Relief to needy.
- Maternity deliveries are conducted at Tayyab Hospital in Deoband, U. P.

ACHIEVEMENTS: 227,000 PATIENTS RECEIVED FREE MEDICAL CARE

SEED FUNDED:

- An Ultra-Sound Machine to provide free imaging to the poor.

EMERGENCY MEDICAL RELIEF:

- Mr. Musheer, a mason, lost his leg in an accident and could not earn money. SEED gave financial aid to the family & provided him a prosthetic leg.



He is able to walk and work.

- A 24 year young man was burnt severely by electricity. Both of his hands were amputated.



SEED provided financial aid (Rupees 200,000) for his post- surgery expenses and provided him with Prosthetic hands costing Rupees 575,000.

This young man is now able to LIVE a Normal LIFE.
