SEED is a "Volunteer Organization". We minimize administrative expenses and pay all local expenses. 100% of Donated Funds go to help the poor.

PROGRAMS

Education Program:

INVESTMENT IN EDUCATION \$580,358

Financial aid for the education of 15,900 children including 3,700 orphans.

- Provided educational support for **poor children in fifty-five schools in thirteen states**. Many schools closed during the lockdown due to financial hardship.
- **Paid Interest-Bearing Bus Loan:** Provided financial aid (\$17,300) to Huda Education and Social Welfare Society to pay out interest bearing loan on three school buses. This resulted in a **savings of Rupees 83,000 of interest per year**.
- **Expenses of orphans:** Paid \$7,100 to cover boarding and lodging expenses of two hundred orphans at a residential orphanage school in Uttar Pradesh. This school was short on funds due to lockdown.
- **Paid salaries of fifteen teachers** at one school.
- **Paid tuition fees of ninety-five students** at two schools. Parents were unable to pay the fees. These schools requested SEED for help



Granted 1,247 scholarships for college education.

- **Seventy-one scholarships** were awarded for higher education (Master's and Doctorate degrees). These scholarships are given to students in Hyderabad, Delhi, AliGarh, Haryana, Gujrat, and in Karnataka.

Financial aid is given to widows, single mothers, and destitute families so that they can live a respectable life and their children can go to school. Financial need of each family is assessed, and a monthly Stipend is given. All families are required to educate their children.

Journalist One-Year Apprentice Program in Second Year (Five Trainees in 2021)

Under SEED's sponsorship two journalist completed one-year training under two senior journalists in 2020.

This year 4 journalists are under training. They will complete their apprenticeship in January 2022. The objective is to impart training to young journalist under the mentorship of a senior journalist to improve their skills. These trainees are committed to write about minority issues in India.



Shalini S. - She has an M.A. in English and Comparative Literature from Pondicherry University, Puducherry. She lives and works between Bengaluru and Chennai.

Mahibul Hoque - He has a postgraduate degree from the AJK Mass Communication Research Centre (AJKMCR), at Jamia Millia Islamia (JMI). He is based out of Darrang, Assam.

Mitesh Vasava - He has a postgraduate degree in mass communication and journalism from Maharaja Sayajirao University of Baroda. He lives and works out of Rajpipla in Narmada district of Gujarat.

Shadab Farooq - He is a final-year student of M.A Mass Communication, at AJKMCR, JMI. He lives and works between Delhi and Kashmir.

Z. Warsi - She joined Graduate School of Journalism at Columbia University, New York. She is a journalist from Mumbai, India and has worked with CNN-News18. She requested SEED for financial support. We granted her \$5,000 scholarship.



Our 2020 Trainees, Ms. Nazish Hussain and Ms. Musheera Ashraf were recognized for their news reports related to the “Shaheen Bagh Protest” in Delhi. They received “Jury Citation Appreciation.”

NEW PROJECTS 2021

■ ONE-YEAR APPRENTICESHIP PROGRAM FOR LAW GRADUATES

SEED started a new 1-Year Apprenticeship Program for Law Graduates. The objective is to provide training to recently graduated students with a Law Degree, so they can help minority communities in India. A senior Advocate is training two law graduates. During this training they are learning “research skills, communications, legal drafting skills, preparing case files and briefs, learning court presence, procedures and practices.

Mr. Mohammed Faisal Uddin and Ms. Hajera Arshad are the two trainees under this Program. SEED Executive Director met them during his visit in October 2021. Both trainees expressed satisfaction with the training and recommended that this Program should be extended in the future. They will complete their training at the end of February 2022.



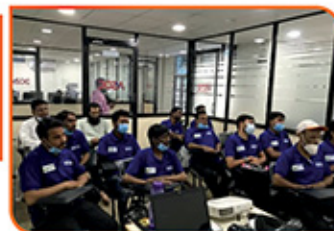
■ SMALL VENDORS TRAINING

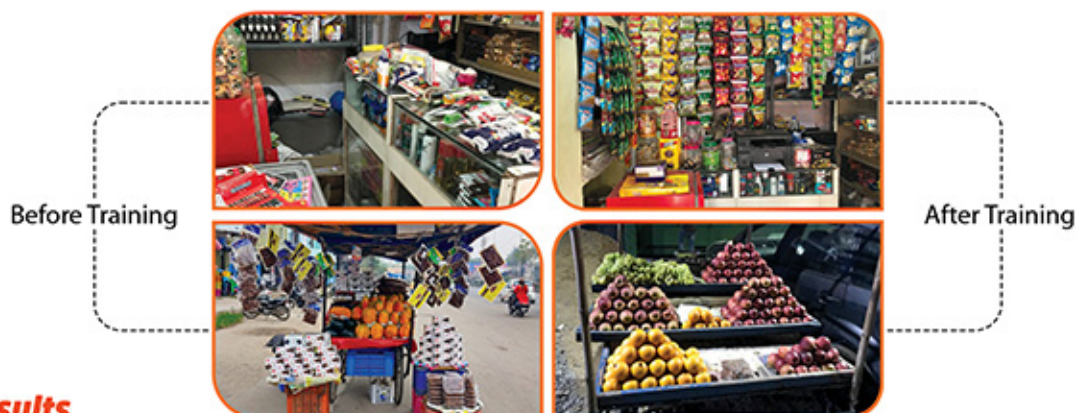
This project was recommended by a SEED donor, **Mr. Qaid Saifi**. **The objective is to improve the business of small entrepreneurs by giving them skills that will improve their business and in turn improve their lives.**

SEED Partnered with The Quran Foundation (TQF), a local NGO in Hyderabad to offer this training. TQF trained the vendors and improved their skills by teaching them marketing, money management, soft skills, and customer relationship.

The program was started with fourteen small vendors and eleven vendors (four vegetable sellers, four fruit sellers, and three small grocery shop owners) completed the training. TQF conducted weekly training classes at Advanced Skills Development Center (ASDC).

The classroom training was conducted by a supervisor and a field supervisor assisted in implementation of training skills at their shops. The vendors were given a stipend of Rupees 500 per session as an incentive for them to attend the training sessions. **The program was successful in improving the businesses of these vendors.**





Results

- Business knowledge improved. Product display/presentation also improved. Shops and Thelas were cleaner after the training. Personal grooming also improved. They learned to manage their inventories and kept written records of transactions. They learned the importance of developing relationships with customers. Learned the use of phone to pay their bills.
- All vendors joined Telugu language class at ASDC. This helped them in serving the Telugu speaking customers.
- Overall, the training was successful. The Quran Foundation recommended to continue this project to train additional vendors in future.

Medical Care Program \$305,275

Islamic Medical Association of North America Grant \$90,000

- SEED provides free of cost Primary Care and Diabetic Care services for the needy. These services are offered free of cost by operating **Six Primary Care Centers** and **Five Diabetic Care Centers**.
- Five Primary Care Centers are in Hyderabad and one Center is in JadishPur, Uttar Pradesh.
- Two of these Primary Care Centers, namely **Rabia Miskin Memorial Clinic** and **Masjid Ishaq Clinic** also offer Dental and Eye Care services.
- **Rabia Miskin Memorial Clinic** is a **Women and Children Clinic**. This Clinic also has a **"Wellness Center for ladies"**. At this Center 40 ladies train for weight loss and general health improvement.
- **Rabia Clinic is sponsored by Dr. M. T. AliNiazee Family Foundation in the memory of his respectable mother.**
- **Fauzan Ahmed Khan Memorial Clinic** is in JagdishPur, Uttar Pradesh. **This Clinic was started in February 2021. This clinic is named after the grand child of Dr. Khizer and Tahira Siddiqui who have sponsored this Clinic.**



■ ISOLATION CENTER FOR COVID PATIENTS:

During the second wave of Covid, there was a severe shortage of hospital beds in Hyderabad. SEED, collaborating with a local partner established a "40-bed Isolation Center" for the Covid Patients. The objective was to provide isolation to the needy, so that the other family members were not affected by Covid. This center provided free of cost isolation and treatment. This service was available 24 hours per day for 3 months. Four doctors and a supporting staff of thirty provided services. A total of 150 patients were treated at this center. This center provided transportation and food as well.

■ Ventilator to Yashfeen Charity Hospital in Navsari, Gujrat (\$13,700):

SEED donated a Hamilton Medical C1 Adult/Pediatric Intelligent Ventilator (20 ml to 200 ml) to Yashfeen hospital to provide free of cost service to the needy.



■ Two Dialysis Machines donated for a Charity Hospital (\$16,300):

Funded purchase of two Dialysis Machines for Al Shifa Charitable Hospital that is in Okhla, in New Delhi. This hospital provides Services to the needy patients at operational costs only.



■ SEED PARTIALLY FINANCED PURCHASE OF AN AMBULANCE FOR HELPING HAND FOUNDATION (\$4,000):

SEED helped Helping Hand Foundation in purchasing a used Ambulance that is equipped to manage wheelchairs and can be used for such patients. This ambulance will be available for all patients requiring transport with wheelchairs and will be located at SEED/HHF's Comfort and Care Center in Hyderabad.



■ WELLNESS CENTER #2 FOR LADIES:

SEED in partnership with Helping Hand Foundation opened a second Wellness Center in Hyderabad in October 2021. At present fifty ladies have joined this center. This center has weight loss training program in addition to general fitness equipment. A qualified female trainer trains these ladies.



■ INDIVIDUALS HELPED (DONORS RECOMMENDED AND DONATED FUNDS FOR THE NEEDY).

Paid Tuition fees Rupees 80,700:

A single parent could not pay tuition fees of her son, M. A. S., who is in his third year of engineering degree. Her husband died and she is raising her only child. She was paying her son's educational expenses until Covid hit and she lost her teaching job. A SEED donor recommended to pay his tuition fees.



A young man came to SEED's Training Center in Hyderabad looking for a job. On inquiry we learned that he is a third-year student in an Engineering college. His father died and he was unable to continue his education. His father's illness caused the family an interest-bearing loan of Rupees 90,000. SEED paid his loan and started paying his family Rupees 10,000 per month. He was advised to continue his education.

Tuition fee for third year Dental College Student Rupees 197,000:

Abdul Basith (not his real name) is studying in third year of BDS degree. He is the only child and his father died 21 years ago. His mother raised him. They live in one room accommodation in a school compound where his mother is employed. When Abdul Basith got admitted to Dental college the well-wishers of the family collected funds and paid his expenses for the first two years. They could not pay third year fee due to Covid related lockdown. SEED paid his tuition and hostel fee for his third year in the program. SEED is committed to pay his final year fees as well so Abdul Basith can become a Dentist and live a decent life.



- **Paid Tuition fees for a B. Pharmacy Student Rupees 35,000:** As recommended by a SEED donor, SEED paid fees for a student whose mother is a widow.
- **Paid Internship fee to the Training Hospital Rupees 30,000:** An auto driver's daughter completed Pharm-D, 6-year PhD course on Government scholarship. She needed training fees to join her internship program.
- **Paid Tuition fees for two girls in degree courses Rupees 65,000:** A SEED donor recommended paying tuition fees of two students. The father is a tailor who was unable to pay the fees.
- **Educational Expenses of one Handicap Girl:** One of our donors is paying educational expenses of one handicap student for last two years (Rupees 36,000 per year).

Hospital bills paid for a Cancer Patient Rupees 310,000:

A cancer patient (Tumor of Bones) had hospital bills. SEED paid Rupees 310,000 to Indo-American Cancer hospital.



- **Paid Interest-Bearing Loan Rupees 119,000:** Mr. A K., an Auto Rikshaw driver, borrowed money on interest by pawning his wife's jewelry while his wife was in the hospital due to Covid. His wife died. One of SEED donor recommended payment of the loan.
- **Medical Bills paid Rupees 90,000:** A SEED donor recommended payment of Rupees 90,000 to a hospital in Karnataka State to settle medical bills of a needy person.
- **Loan was paid back for a widow Rupees 200,000:** Mr. M. K. A. borrowed Rupees 200,000 to conduct repairs to his residence. Few months later Mr. M. K. A. died leaving the loan unpaid to his friend. A SEED donor recommended and funded the payment.
- **Ventilator for a patient with blood disorder:** A SEED donor donated Rupees 20,000 and a ventilator was donated to a needy patient on his recommendation.

Financial support for Lung Transplant Rupees 600,000:

Ms. S. K. had collapsed lungs and needed a transplant. She came to Hyderabad for the transplant. Helping Hand Foundation helped her, and SEED provided the funds. She had a successful transplant and was recovering at of end of November 2021.



POST COVID SUPPORT

● **Post Covid Support in Nuzvid, Andhra Pradesh:**

Financial aid was given to sixty-eight families to help them with lockdown loss of income and to provide medical relief.



● **Post Covid Support in New Delhi:** All India Graduates Association, a local NGO, requested SEED for financial support to help the needy in Okhla city in New Delhi. With SEED's Grant of Rupees 750,000 they provided:

- Ration kits to 150 needy families.
- Distributed Immunity kits (Containing Calcium supplements, Zinc & Vitamin D 3 tablets, Multi- vitamins, Steam inhalers, herbal supplements, and Face masks).
- Distributed equipment (25 Pulse- Oxymeters, 10 Infra-red Thermometers, 19 Nebulizers, 10 PPE Kits, 10 Face Shields, 5 Oxygen Cylinders with flow meters) to local clinics, labs, and individuals.
- Distributed fifteen "Thelas" to needy small vendors. These vendors lost their "Thelas" during 2020 Delhi Riots.



● **Food Distribution in Gujrat:** During the Covid lockdown many ladies lost their jobs in the suburbs of Ahmedabad, Gujrat State. Sambodh, a local NGO, requested SEED for financial support. Food packets were distributed to one hundred needy women using SEED's Grant of Rupees 150,000.

● **Food Distribution in Hyderabad:**

Financial aid was given to nineteen needy families identified by a SEED donor (Rupees 150,000).



● **GOOD SAMARITAN (Auto Driver in Bhopal) was Helped:**

An Auto Driver (Mr. A. K) sold his wife's jewelry and equipped his Auto with Oxygen Cylinder and started transporting Covid patients to the hospitals. One of our SEED donors saw this news. He donated Rupees 10,000. SEED gave these funds to Mr. A. K. for purchasing new jewelry for his wife.



SUCCESS STORY OF A WIDOW FAMILY

In 2013 a widow, Sister Z. Begum

was referred to SEED by a well-wisher of the family. Sister Z. has four children and her husband died in 2012. She did not have any support from her family and was facing difficulty educating her children. SEED started paying a monthly stipend to this family.

After eight years, this year (2021) the eldest son, R. Uddin applied and was granted a merit scholarship. He is a first year MBA student. On inquiry he said his mother always prayed for SEED and SEED's donors. With SEED's financial support, the children were able to continue their schooling and the family lived a respectable life.

R. Uddin informed SEED Executive Director that one of his sisters is married and other two siblings are in college.

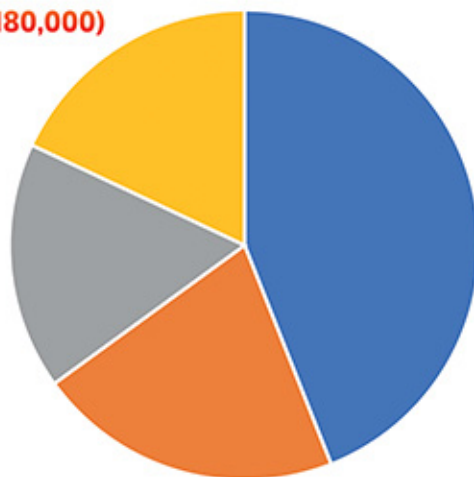
