PROGRAMS

Education Program: **INVESTMENT IN EDUCATION \$665,977)**

Financial aid for the education of 15,000 children including 2,500 orphans.

- Provided educational support for poor children in fifty-six schools in fourteen states.
- **Granted thirteen hundred (1,300) scholarships** for college education.
- **Eleven hundred scholarships** were granted to Intermediate and BS degree students.
- **Two hundred and fourteen scholarships** were awarded for higher education (Master's and Doctorate degrees).
- These scholarships are given to students in Telangana State, New Delhi, Uttar Pradesh, Haryana, Gujrat, and Karnataka.

Granted thirteen hundred (1,300) scholarships for college education.

NEW PROJECTS 2022

■ **COMPUTER AND LANGUAGE TRAINING FOR “ULAMA” AND “HUFFAZ”**

Madrassa graduates (Ulema and Huffaz) study in Urdu and are not able to speak other languages. SEED initiated a project to educate these graduates in computer courses as well as language training. SEED is offering “free of tuition” courses for these graduates and giving them transportation allowance. A total of seventy-nine Ulema and Huffaz completed 3-month computer and language courses. Forty-four trainees completed English and Hindi language courses and a computer course of their choice at Patna (State of Bihar Center). Thirty-five trainees completed English and Telugu language courses with a computer course at Hyderabad center.

Our objective is that these scholars will spread their knowledge and clear misconceptions about our “deen” in our community and in general population.

■ **SCHOOL IN WEST BENGAL**

SEED is providing financial aid to pay teacher’s salaries and for Mid-Day Meal for students. This school is in a low-income area and the students come to the school without eating breakfast. School building is unfinished. SEED is also funding construction of the school building this year to provide a decent facility for the poor children at this school.

There are 200 students at this school.



Widow & Destitute Family Support Program:

\$407,947

Financial aid is given to widows, single mothers, and destitute families so that they live a respectable life and their children can go to school. Financial need of each family is assessed, and a monthly Stipend is given. All families are required to educate their children. These families are in TS, AP, Karnataka, UP, Delhi, Gujrat, Maharashtra, Madhya Pradesh & Tamil Nadu.

Case 1: Electric Rickshaw and Crutches for Needy

Dr. AMH, A translator in the Arabic Department in a prominent university in North India requested SEED for an Electric Rickshaw. He is a handicapped person and could not afford to purchase one. He uses a manual rickshaw. Due to manual rickshaw, he is tired and unable to obtain a better paying job at a distance from his residence. SEED provided him with an Electric Rickshaw. This will ease his transportation and he may be able to get a better paying job.



One of SEED donor recommended that SEED provide Crutches for a needy person. His wooden crutches were old and broken. SEED purchased new crutches for him.

Case 2: Financial Aid

Mr. MAH contacted SEED for financial aid. He has a low paying job and is unable to pay educational expenses of his four children. His oldest son got admission in an Engineering college, and he had to pay tuition fees for the other three school going children for last two years. One of our SEED donors donated funds (\$3,200) to help Mr. MAH. SEED paid tuition fees and purchased a lap top computer for his son and paid tuition fees for the other three children.



Case 3: Financial Aid

Mr. SS Uddin lost his job due to ill health and was unable to meet his family's expenses and his children's school fee. A SEED donor recommended his case and donated \$2,500. SEED paid 8 months of back rent and paid school fee for his children. SEED continued financial support.

Br. SS Uddin passed away, and SEED has adopted this family under SEED's Widow and Destitute Family Support Program.

Case 4: Financial Aid

Mr. JH was a Car Salesperson and lost his job during Pandemic. A SEED donor recommended his case and donated \$1,100. SEED paid his children's school fee and paid seven months back rent.

Case 5: Financial Aid

A young sister had a disorder called "Strabismus" (Cross Eyed). Due to this condition, she was not getting marriage proposals. She could not afford expenses of the surgery to correct this defect. A SEED donor donated \$1,000. The surgery was successful.



Case 6: Financial Aid

SEED paid tuition and hostel fee for a sister who got admission in a medical college. Her father is a tailor and could not afford to pay her college expenses. SEED also paid final year tuition of a sister whose father passed away and she needed this financial support to complete her degree.



Case 7:

A donor informed that a widow sister needed financial support. She is living with her mother, a mentally challenged brother and with her two children. She is also in college to become a nurse so she could support her family. SEED is paying her monthly expenses as well as educational expenses through a local NGO in India. She will graduate in 2024.

Case 8:

SEED paid \$6,000 towards the hospital bills of a Cancer Patient in India as this case was referred by one of our donors.

Case 9:

A SEED donor requested financial aid for a family. The daughter in the family delivered a baby and ended up in critical condition due to complications. The family could not pay the hospital bill and borrowed money as well as pawned jewelry at a high interest rate. SEED paid their loans and paid for the pawned jewelry also.



Case 10:

A US based charity recommended a BDS student to SEED. Father abandoned the family 10 years ago and mother is a teacher in a private school. Her tuition and transportation fee are Rupees 125,000. Her mother paid Rupees 45,000 and needed help to pay the rest of the amount. After verification of the information SEED paid Rupees 80,000 to the institution.



Training Program Leading to Employment

INVESTMENT \$311,925

This program trains and provides skills to school dropouts and unemployed youth. Free of cost vocational and other training is provided to help these youth towards employment and a respectable life.

■ JOURNALIST ONE-YEAR APPRENTICE PROGRAM (SECOND YEAR) (EIGHT TRAINEES IN 2022)

Under SEED sponsorship six journalist completed one-year Apprentice training program under senior journalists since 2020.



The current batch of eight journalists will complete their apprenticeship in January 2023. The objective is to impart training to young journalist under the mentorship of a senior journalist to improve their skills. These trainees are committed to write about minority issues in India.

■ ONE-YEAR APPRENTICESHIP PROGRAM FOR LAW GRADUATES

Total Trainees = 4(2/2021 + 2/2022)

SEED started a new 1-Year Apprenticeship Program for Law Graduates in 2021. The objective is to provide training to recently graduated students with a Law Degree, so they can help minority communities in India. A senior Advocate is training two law graduates. During this training they are learning "research skills, communications, legal drafting skills, preparing case files and briefs, learning court presence, procedures, and practices.

Ms. Samina Yasmeen and Ms. Sara Tabassum are the two trainees under this Program. SEED Executive Director met them during his visit in October 2022. Both trainees expressed satisfaction with the training and recommended that this Program should be extended in the future. They will complete their training at the end of February 2023.



■ SMALL VENDORS DEVELOPMENT TRAINING PROGRAM

This project was recommended by a SEED donor, **Mr. Quaid Saifi**. **The objective is to improve the business of small entrepreneurs by giving them skills that will improve their business and in turn improve their lives.**

SEED Partnered with The Quran Foundation (TQF), a local NGO in Hyderabad to offer this training. TQF trained the vendors and improved their skills by teaching them marketing, money management, soft skills, and customer relationship.



This year we have started this training in the City of Patna, State of Bihar in addition to Hyderabad, State of Telengana. A total of thirty-five vendors are participating in this program.

Medical Care Program \$ 301,925

BENEFICIARIES 336,750

Islamic Medical Association of North America Granted \$90,000 for Medical Relief.

- SEED provides free of cost Primary Care and Diabetic Care services for the needy. These services are offered free of cost by operating **Six Primary Care Centers** and **Five Diabetic Care Centers**.
- **Five Primary Care Centers** are in Hyderabad and one Center is in Jagdishpur, Uttar Pradesh.
- Two of these Primary Care Centers, namely **Rabia Miskin Memorial Clinic** and **Masjid Ishaq Clinic** also offer **Dental and Eye Care** services.
- **Rabia Miskin Memorial Clinic** is a **Women and Children Clinic**. This Clinic also has a **"Wellness Center for ladies"**. At this Center 40 ladies train for weight loss and general health improvement.
- **Rabia Miskin Clinics (3 branches)** are sponsored by **Dr. M. T. AliNiazee Family Foundation**.
- **Fauzan Ahmed Khan Memorial Clinic** is in JagdishPur, Uttar Pradesh. This Clinic was started in February 2021. This clinic is sponsored by **Dr. Khizer Siddiqui**.

■ **NEW CLINICS:**

- **Quadri Clinic (Primary Care Clinic) was opened in March of 2022.**
- **Public Care Clinic was opened on 15th of November 2022 at Bhopal, Madhya Pradesh.**



NEW PROJECTS 2022

■ **FREE OF COST DIALYSIS CENTER (ESTABLISHED IN 2022):**

This center is saving one Crore Rupees (\$135,000) for the needy patients.

A free of cost Dialysis Treatment Center was inaugurated in July 2022 with 5 Dialysis Machines. At present this center has 9 Dialysis machines. This center is in the basement of a masjid in Hyderabad, Telengana State.



The free of cost treatment at this Center results in a savings of Rupees 3,000 per treatment. SEED Donors donated 8 machines. One machine is donated by a local donor. Helping Hand Foundation, a local NGO, SEED's partner, is paying the operating expenses.

Thirty-six patients are registered and getting free of cost treatments. Since Inauguration a total of 963 treatments were conducted.

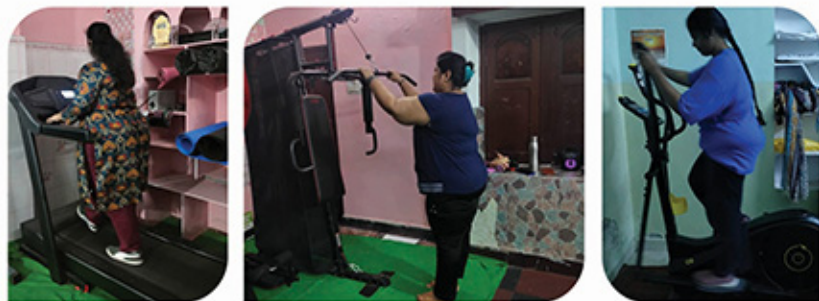
Savings to 36 patients Rupees 2,889,000 in 3.25 Months.

Savings to one patient per month Rupees 27,000.

Savings for one patient per year - Rupees 324,000.

■ **WELLNESS CENTERS FOR LADIES:**

SEED in partnership with Helping Hand Foundation operates two Wellness Centers in Hyderabad. One hundred ladies are benefiting from these centers. These centers have weight loss training program in addition to general fitness equipment. Qualified female trainers provide training.



■ MATERNITY HOSPITAL SUPPORT

SEED in partnership with Islamic Oasis Organization (Chicago) provided funding (Rupees 21,50,000) to a charity Maternity hospital in Aurangabad, State of MahaRashtra. With this funding the local NGO, AlKhidmah Trust, was able to purchase a Generator, instruments and furniture for this hospital. This hospital will be operational as of January 15th 2023.



■ WATER WELL FOR SLUM AREA RESIDENTS

In Aurangabad there is a huge slum area where there is no water supply. Residents have to bring water using water tankers. SEED funded one "Bore Well". This well is drilled and is providing water to 125 families. SEED has plans to fund additional water wells in this area.



SUCCESS STORY OF A WIDOW FAMILY

In 2013 a widow, Sister S. Fatima

was referred to SEED by a well-wisher of the family. Sister S. Fatima has four children and her husband died in 2012. She did not have any support from her family and was facing difficulty educating her children. SEED started paying a monthly stipend to this family. After eight years, this year (2022) two of her sons completed degrees in engineering, third son is in final year of B. Tech degree and fourth son has completed a diploma in Civil Engineering. With SEED's financial support, the children were able to continue their schooling and the family lived a respectable life. Sister S. Fatima informed SEED that she no longer needs financial support. AH, this family is self-dependent after 8 years of support. **Two sons are "hafiz-e-Quran."**

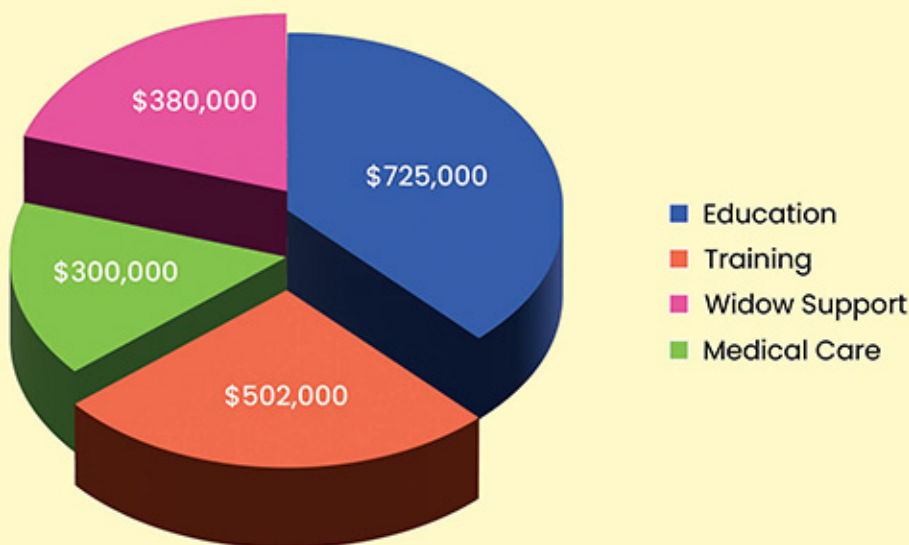
