YOUR DONATIONS ARE CHANGING LIVES IN INDIA

Comfort and Care Center (Rehab Center) for seniors

SEED has established a first of its kind Rehabilitation Services Center in the city of Hyderabad, India. This Center is a 25-bed state of the art facility, that provides rehab services such as post stroke complications, tracheostomy care, dementia care, post-Covid and general rehab for the elderly patients.



A survey of local hospitals revealed that the rehab services in the city are expensive and inaccessible for the middle-income and low-income families. This center is operated on a **Non- Profit Basis**. The objective is to offer high quality rehab care at affordable prices in a highly hygienic and safe environment.

The services offered at Comfort and Care Center are 50 to 70 percent cheaper compared to the services offered by Corporate hospitals.





The Comfort and Care Center is managed by Helping Hand Foundation, the operational partner of SEED and is run by a dedicated team of doctors, male and female nurses, bedside care givers, physiotherapists, counsellors and housekeeping staff providing round the clock service. The facility has a physiotherapy lab and a kitchen that provides nutritious and hygienic food to the patients. Laundry services are also available. An ambulance is placed at the Center to meet the emergency requirements of the patients and specialist doctors are also available on-call.

Rabia Clinic – Free Medical Care for Women and Children

Our goal is to provide free of cost medical care for slum area women and children. SEED in partnership with a local NGO, Helping Hand Foundation, has established The Rabia Clinic at Masjid Mohammed-e-Mustafa in Hyderabad.

This clinic is named after the mother of Dr. M. T Aliniasee, who donated funds through AliNiasee Charitable Foundation. This center is for women and children and 90% of the staff is women. Specialist doctors for children, obstetrics & gynaecology specialist, a dental surgeon, dietician, and counselors are available.

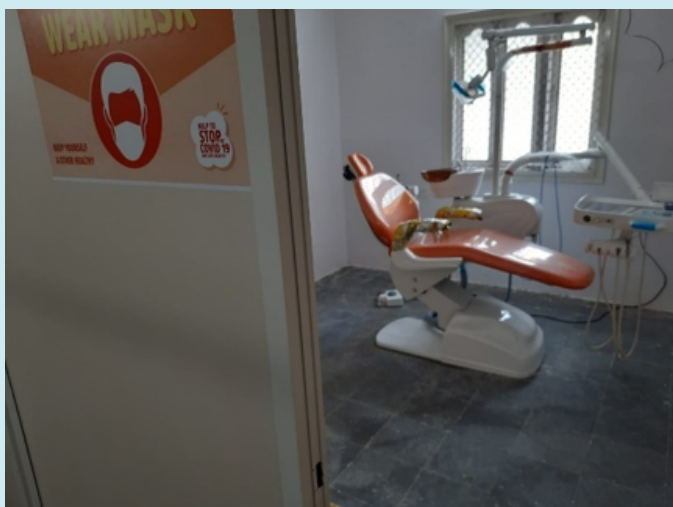

Rabia Clinic is located between slum areas and will serve the needy community. Due to poverty many women and children are malnourished. These services include health care and services like nebulization, intravenous (IV) fluid replacement etc. and free third-part Diagnostic lab services that include TIFFA scans.



Apart from curative aspects, the clinic will also focus on preventive health to check for non-communicable diseases, anemia in women during pre-childbirth and post-childbirth periods. Trained counsellors and dieticians will help the patients by providing advice.

The clinic is equipped to provide dental care services also.

Support for Children: 100 children (10-year-old and younger) are being provided with mid-day meals 3 times per week. Iron and nutritional supplements along with vitamins are being provided to children who are found deficient.

COVID-19 Aid

SEED is not a Relief Organization but due to the sudden lock down announced by the government of India resulting in chaos and suffering for the poor. To reduce the suffering of the needy, SEED Board of Directors decided to provide help.

SEED provided Food Aid to 4,900 families (supplies for one month) that benefited 25,000 people. This aid was distributed in Hyderabad, rural areas around Hyderabad, Delhi, Surat (Gujrat), and Tamil Nadu.



Aid to Delhi Riot Victims

There were 53 deaths. SEED could obtain information on 9 widow families. SEED has sponsored these 9 families and 19 orphans. We are giving each widow Rupees 5,000 per month and Rupees 1,500 per orphan child. Our support will continue for long term until these families no longer need help.



SEED donors contributed \$20,000 for relief effort and these funds were sent to a local NGO in Delhi to provide financial support to the victims. These victims were identified by our donors.

Two Orphan Girls Graduated from Medical College

SEED's top priority is educating the poor. Under our Education Program we educate 18,000 children and grant 800 scholarships to college students.

We support college education of 18 girls at an orphanage that shelters 300 girls in the State of Karnataka. This year two students have completed MBBS degree and are going through training (residency). Both students are interested in continuing higher education and want to join MD Program.

SEED has been supporting college education of orphan girls at this orphanage for last 4 years. To date, many girls have completed their education and obtained Engineering Degree (3), Architecture Degree (2), Medical Degree (2 recently) and many others completed graduation and diploma courses.

SEED Endowment Fund

SEED Board established an Endowment Fund in 2018 on the recommendation of our donors. We received few donations. This year due to the existing conditions we were unable to raise required funds. We are 30% behind our need for 2021. This will force us to use the funds saved in our Endowment Fund.

To ensure that we continue our work in future and be ready for any future disruptions in our efforts to raise funds we need to replenish our Endowment Fund.

We request you to donate generously for the Endowment Fund. We have 1,800 donors. If each donor donates \$200 then we could add reserves of \$360,000 in our Endowment Fund.
